A BLIND woman was barred from an easyJet flight because staff didn't believe her poodle-cross was a guide dog.

Joanna Jones, 34, had previously flown with

six-year-old Orla without problems.

But easyJet's staff at Gatwick wanted proof her part-labrador was trained.

Joanna was stuck at check-in for two hours - then told she could not board the flight to Belfast on Sunday.

A confirmation email from guide dog officials arrived too late and Joanna had to stay at her mum's in Hants before getting a flight yesterday.
